She moved from Gallatin to Our Lady of Mercy Country home in November 2009, & enjoyed every minute of her stay. She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Liberty, & attended every Sunday with her son, Kent. They both enjoyed this special time together. She thought Landon Whitsitt was a wonderful pastor. She always looked forward to the music of the pianist, Calvin Parmenter. The ladies of the church were so good to her, & she made friends with all of them. She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, & held state offices of Regent, Vice Regent, Chaplain & Recording Secretary. She was a member of Chapter BQ, P.E.O. Sisterhood, & loved to play bridge. She was a Sunday School teacher for 25 years, & an elementary school teacher for 21 years & loved her students.
