Charles entered the United States Army in June, 1972. He was trained as an armor crewman, airborne infantryman and operations and intelligence specialist. Duty stations included Fort Leonard Wood, MO, Fort Carson, CO, Fort Lewis, WA and Fort Benning, GA. He was stationed with the 3rd Infantry Division in Germany from August, 1974 through June, 1976. He was honorably discharged from Fort Dix, NJ in June, 1976.

For his service, Charles was awarded several badges and medals including Parachutist Badge, Sharpshooter Badge with Grenade Bar Decal, National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal and Cold War Victory Medal.



Charles retired from his civilian career as a lineman and project estimator after 30 years' service with Alliant Energy. He and his wife, Teresa, have three children and one grandchild. Charles is a member of the Sons of the American Revolution and the local Republican Central Committee. He volunteers at his local historical museum where he has been instrumental in developing a display on WWI and WWII.
