Isaac entered the United States Army in January 1952. Following basic training at Camp Crowder, MO and additional training at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, MD, he was sent to Korea where he worked as a track section chief.

For his service, Isaac received the Korean Service Medal with three Bronze Stars, United Nations Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation and Good Conduct Medal. He was honorably discharged from active duty in December 1953.

Several service experiences stand out as memorable. "I was assigned to repair any Army equipment that was in need, be it tanks, trucks, busses, Jeeps or personnel vehicles", says Isaac, "At one point we were asked to do repairs on enemy vehicles and then test drive them. When our supervisor's found out they put a stop to it and we never had that problem again." Another fond memory Isaac shared was being able to visit with native Koreans and children who were always busy and friendly. Finally, headed home to Missouri after discharge, Isaac says "My airplane was headed to Kansas City Airport and the pilot made a special circle over the Plaza so we could see all the beautiful Christmas lights and made it a much happier Welcome Home!"

In civilian life, Isaac and his wife have been married 64 years. They have two children, two grandchildren and seven great grandchildren. In 2017 Isaac celebrated 50 years working with the Cameron Fire Department. He is a member of the American Legion, Masonic Lodge, VFW, and his local church.
