Roscoe graduated from high school in 1953. He enlisted in the United States Army in March 1956 and went to basic training at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas. He served 20 years and saw duty in the following places: Korea – Fort Richardson, Alaska – Fort Riley, Kansas – Fort Carson, Colorado – Fort Benning, Georgia - Fort Campbell, Kentucky – Fort Meade, Maryland – Schofield Barracks, Hawaii and his last duty assignment was with the 3rd Armored Division in Germany. He also received training at West Point, New York.

Roscoe was honorably discharged and retired at Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri in April 1976 as a Sergeant and a Communications Chief. After retiring, he was placed on the retired list and transferred to the United States Army Reserve (Retired Reserve). While in the military, Roscoe received the following medals: National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal – Korea, Good Conduct Medal (4th Award) and Sharpshooter Qualification Badge with Rifle (M16).

After retiring from the military and returning home to Missouri, Roscoe worked as a bus driver for the Westran School for 29 years.

Roscoe married Dorothy and they had four children. Dorothy has passed away.

Roscoe attends his local Methodist Church and is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion. He enjoys putting puzzles together.
